Webinar and Lecture Programmes

Webinar on Use of E-resources:

The IQAC Cell and Library of this institution jointly organized a Webinar on Use of e-resources in collaboration with Assam College Library Association on 10. 06. 2020. Republic Day Celebration

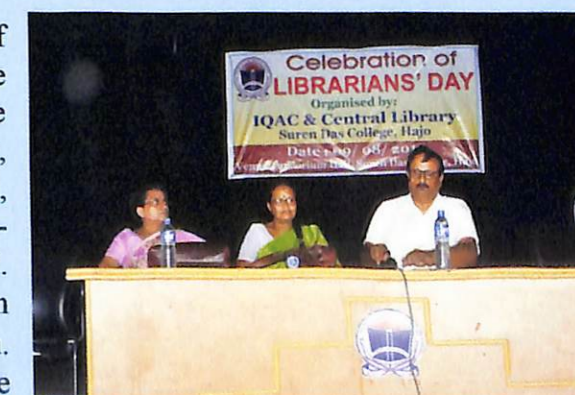

Leadership Talk

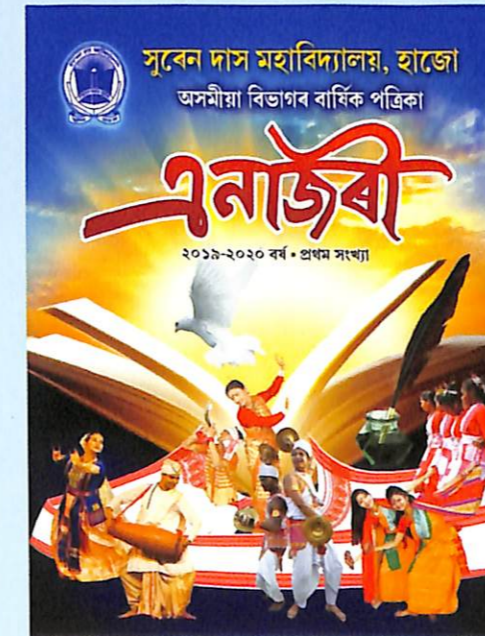

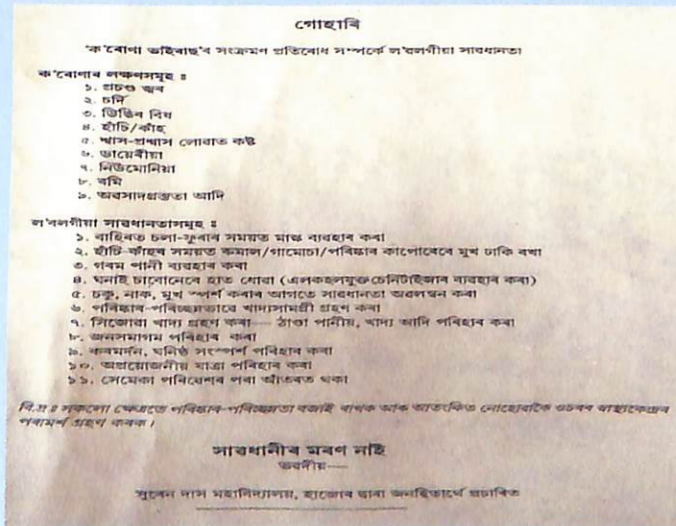
New Addition in the College Library
